Dr. Tiersky earned her dental degree from the Loyola University School of Dentistry. She then earned her Juris Doctor degree from the John Marshall Law School. Dr. Tiersky is a member of the American Dental Association, Illinois State Dental Society and the Alpha Omega Dental Fraternity. She is a Fellow of the Academy of Dentistry International, American College of Dentists, International College of Dentists, Pierre Fauchard Academy and The Odontographic Society of Chicago.

She has been practicing dentistry for the past 31 years. She has been licensed to practice law in Illinois since 1991, and is a Board member of The Healthcare Foundation of Highland Park.

Dr. Tiersky lives in Highland Park with her husband Roland Davidson and their daughter Devin.
